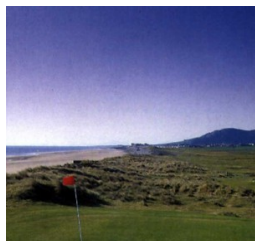
About Aberdovey and Gwynedd

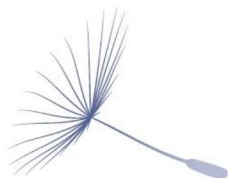
